Background information includes:

What is a commercial pipeline?

A commercial pipeline is a forward look of potential commercial activity for an organisation. It's a live tool, updated regularly, providing a list of future commercial activities planned by a contracting authority over a defined period and over a designated transactional spend level. It includes future activity even if funding hasn't been secured.

A pipeline allows a contracting authority to forward plan and clearly map out the expected future commercial activity (new contract or major contract change or extension) that it's likely to need. The pipeline can be used alongside other information on internal business planning and governance stages, and other related activities.

By mapping out this management information and keeping this regularly updated, organisations can:

- * give enough planning time for developing and executing a robust commercial strategy, making sure that all business and commercial options have been thoroughly explored
- * make the market aware of future opportunities, ensuring a competitive market exists
- * outline when the required services are intended to be procured
- * track commercial delivery
- * give clear management information to inform current and future resourcing for commercial delivery
- * reduce the need for unwarranted contract extensions by improved planning
- * ensure transparency when going to market

What is procurement on a page?

Procurement on a page gives additional information on the scope of key procurement opportunities, by expanding upon the existing descriptors in the quarterly procurement plan.

Each Complete Tender Management (CTM) Planned Procurement (CTM PP) https://sharedsystems.eu-supply.com/login.asp number is unique to the specific procurement. This enables the supply chain to cross reference from the quarterly procurement plan to the individual procurements on a page and vice versa.

Due to the nature of our business, we recognise understanding the procurement opportunities may not be immediately clear from the simple procurement title included in the procurement plan.

The purpose of the document is to provide the supply chain with greater visibility of our key procurements by expanding on the procurement detail.

The procurements on a page document is intended as a guide and specific procurement details will be made available to the supply chain through the normal competition process.

SME Spotlight

McMenon Engineering Services, whose Workington facility has a 75-year engineering and manufacturing heritage is the focus of this month's SME feature.

Its West Cumbrian facility designs and manufactures flow and temperature measurement products, supplying to more than 50 countries around the world and also offers fabrication and pipework services.

CEO Anand Puthran said: "We have recently collaborated with TIS Cumbria, resulting in the North West Energy Coast (NWEC) Alliance which has just been engaged as a key delivery partner for the Programme and Project Partners (PPP) framework.

"We were appointed to help deliver fabricated and manufactured equipment packages for Sellafield projects, and this is the first of the goods/services agreements to be awarded as part of a major framework.

"Last year, Sellafield approached us for gas mass flow meters, and we built a new gas calibration facility on our site based on the requirements. The result was a six week turnaround for the units.

"McMenon has built up a global reputation for manufacturing quality specialist products for a range of industries, including energy, water, nuclear, defence, food and beverage and process industries.



"We were delighted late last year to pick up two industry awards in the export and resilience categories at the Energy Industries Council Awards.

"Our business has continued to grow under uncertain times, including Covid, which is testament to the capabilities and innovation within the team at McMenon.

"SME's are the heartbeat of the community and the majority of our workforce are skilled West Cumbrian people.

"We are always looking to enhance our skills and expand our capabilities and to grow across different markets and regions. We are proud of our past but even more excited by our future."
