Sellafield's Skills Recognised on National Stage



There was a triple celebration at the UK Nuclear Skills Awards, which shined a light on the company's award-winning graduate and apprentice training programme.

The company received plaudits in the 'Best Employer and Training Provider Partnership' category, while Jack Robinson and Alex Rawlinson were shortlisted for the 'Intermediate Apprentice and Higher and Degree Apprentice of the Year' respectively.

Sellafield Ltd and Dove Nest were selected as finalists for the best employer/training provider thanks to the development of a behavioural programme for new graduates, bridging the gap between university and work.

Alex and Jack meanwhile highlight why Sellafield Ltd's Apprentice Programme was last year recognised as one of the top 100 large apprentice employers in the UK by the Department for Education.

Sellafield Ltd's Donna Connor presented the 'Nuclear Ambassador of the Year' award. She said "This prestigious event highlights the breadth of opportunities in the sector and I'm delighted that two of our former apprentices have received deserved recognition."

A team of specialist nuclear divers are carrying out vital clean-up and decommissioning work in the oldest legacy storage pond on the Sellafield site.

In December 2022 Josh Everett, a diver from the specialist U.S nuclear diving team Underwater Construction Corporation Ltd, became the first person in over 60 years to work in one of the most unique workplaces in the world.

The 100 metre long outdoor pond was used for the cooling, storage, and de-canning of spent fuel from the reactors as part of the UK's post-war atomic weapons programme.

Operations ceased in the 1960s and in the years that followed sludges formed from the decaying nuclear fuel, algae and other debris.

Divers enter the pond via a specially installed access platform and position themselves on a metal dive stand with a shielded floor. From here they were able to work in shifts of up to 3.5 hours at a time to retrieve sludges and debris from the pond floor, corners and other hard-to-reach areas.

Carl Carruthers, Head of Programme Delivery for Legacy Ponds, said: "The Pile Fuel Storage Pond diver project has been 5 years in the planning and has been a huge success. The team are used to diving in toxic and hazardous environments all over the world, including inside nuclear vessels, but this is a first for us. Their work has helped us make real progress in cleaning up the pond and our site mission to deal with the nuclear legacy and create a clean and safe environment for future generations."



It's difficult to condense five years of work into 10 minutes, but we give it a go in our new success video celebrating the work done in getting a dive team into the Pile Fuel Storage Pond.

STEM Boost for West Cumbrian Schools Through Industry-Funded Programme

Technology is at the forefront of education and students and teachers at 14 Cumbrian schools are set to benefit, thanks to a collaboration between 3D printing experts, 3D 360 and Sellafield Ltd.

3D printing and digital manufacturing business 3D 360 is providing equipment and 5 days of specialist teacher training to enable young people to experience digital manufacturing and to make STEM subjects more appealing.

Through 3D 360's LIFT programme, (Local Industry Funding Technology) companies can fund equipment and training for a single or multiple schools in their area. Sellafield Ltd agreed to support and fund the LIFT programme in West Cumbria through its SiX, Social Impact Multiplied, programme.

Lee Fogg, Technical Director of 3D 360 said: "This technology and training will help students gain vital practical skills in a fast-growing industrial sector and help address the decline in STEM subjects by providing a whole new style of learning for students who may find the typical academic curriculum difficult."

Morgan Sindall Infrastructure win Silver Award for Carbon Reduction Work at Sellafield

Eldon Garnett, MD for Morgan Sindall Infrastructure Nuclear said: "We're delighted to land the Silver in the Green World Awards for our efforts in driving a sustained carbon reduction plan. Working with clients like Sellafield Ltd who have shared outcomes and long term commitments helps turn visions into reality. We strive to build further on this achievement and help Sellafield deliver its carbon vision."

Morgan Sindall Infrastructure was one of the first infrastructure companies to sign up for the Science Based Targets initiative and set carbon reduction targets. As a result, the below initiatives have delivered:

- Solar pods: replacing conventional fossil fuelpowered generators and power sources with solar pods to generate renewable energy. This saving is equivalent to planting circa 3,000 trees per annum.
- Vehicle fleet: there has been a 39% reduction in carbon emissions from the group's vehicle fleet from the 2019 baseline and installation of 26 charge points in Cumbria.

- Procurement: Morgan Sindall Infrastructure are a founder member of the Supply Chain Sustainability School for our supply chain. The school enables suppliers to continually learn and upskill knowledge within the environment sector.
- HVO: Morgan Sindall Infrastructure was one of the first companies to introduce Hydrogenated Vegetable Oil fuel (HVO) in West Cumbria. Within the Infrastructure Strategic Alliance (ISA) all vans, plant and machines operated are now run off sustainable fuel.
- Sourcedog: Morgan Sindall Infrastructure have trialled and approved an intuitive tool named Sourcedog to assess the sustainable nature of their supply chain. Questions set around each partners carbon and sustainability credentials will be stored. The aim is to encourage supply chain partners to consider and align with Morgan Sindall's environmental standards and targets to collaborate to a high sustainable standard.

Supply Chain BULLETIN

Supply Chain Directorate Capability Programme Update

The Supply Chain Directorate Capability Programme has continued to progress in the last quarter with the ongoing delivery of activities on the 6 Learning Pathways: Category Management (CM), Supply Chain & Market Analysis (SC&MA), Supplier, Contract & Risk Management (SC&RM), Sourcing & Negotiation (S&N), Sustainability and Behavioural.

Since our last update, we have hosted a further 14 Behavioural clinics throughout February and March, covering topics such as Story Telling & Elevator Pitches, The Governance Basics, and Creating Space for Creativity and, as part of the SC&RM Pathway, we have also delivered 4 briefing sessions to introduce the Sellafield Supplier Relationship Management Handbook.

In terms of pathway delivery for the current financial year, we have now finalised our programme of Practitioner level workshops and clinics.

In the coming months, we very much look forward to hosting a Supplier & Contract Classification Clinic (16th May), a Contract Management Introductory Workshop (30th/31st May), and a Contract Management Plans Clinic (14th June) which all form part of the SC&RM Pathway. The first Sourcing & Negotiation Introductory Workshop has been scheduled (8th/9th June) and we will also be hosting a final Category Strategy Introductory Workshop (15th/16th June).

July continues to be a busy month with an additional 6 planned activities across the SC&RM, SC&MA, and S&N Pathways.

Through the course of the year, we will also be developing a further 5 Category Family Plans and 8 Category Strategies, whilst implementing 9 previously approved Category Strategies. Developing these Plans and Strategies has already helped identify significant commercial opportunity for Sellafield, in addition to promoting a cohesive approach to Category Management across the organisation, supporting the proactive management of a broad range of risks whilst also further enhancing capabilities across the Directorate.

SUPPLY CHAIN SUCCESS STORY

Pile Chimney Barrel Demolition Mock-Up

DSD Construction Ltd, a local SME, recently created a mock-up of Sellafield's Pile Chimney barrel on behalf of Adapt, a joint venture comprised of Altrad Babcock Atkins and Orano.

The project, which took place over a four month period, involved the site preparation and construction of a 7.5 m high full-scale mock-up of the Chimney barrel, which is due for demolition.

The mock-up was used to test the demolition rig and demonstrate the demolition methodology for the decommissioning of the 120m radioactively contaminated chimney.

The scope of work was to construct the full-scale chimney mock-up at an off-site test facility in West Cumbria to allow our client to install and test the decommissioning rig. This involved:

- •Excavation of foundations and removal and disposal of 200Te of waste.
- •Backfill the foundation with stone and concrete blinding.
- Install foundation and wall starter rebar.

- •Pour the concrete foundation pad.
- Install 7.5m high curved trapeze RMD Kwikform formwork in 2m lifts in two semi-circular halves.
- •Construct personnel access aperture.
- •Install shuttering and rebar between the formwork shells.
- •Pour the wall concrete in 2 off 14-hour pours.

Category Updates

Access Services & Insulation (ASI) Prior Information Notice (PIN) 2

Sellafield is continuing with market engagement for the ASI procurement up until release of the Contract Notice (Excepted in August 2023). The ASI will replace the current Sellafield Industrial Services (SIS) framework, which is due to expire in November 2024. The ASI will be a single lot, four-year framework with an advertised value of £95m. The main services under this procurement are:

 Access Services: Design, manufacture, installation, and deployment of access systems including scaffolding, powered access systems, roped access, rigging, cranes and any other systems of providing Sellafield Ltd staff and contractors access to various locations at each of their facilities



Asbestos and Insulation
 Services: Removal and replacement of thermal insulation, including asbestos containing materials and lagging

Organisations are invited to submit responses to PIN2 via Sellafield's ATAMIS system to the "Lines of Enquiry" set out in Appendix A. Tenderers must register their interest, obtain further information for this notice and submit their response via the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority and Sellafield Ltd.'s E-procurement system, Atamis.
